With the rainy season here, it is important to make sure that everyone is doing their part to prevent water runoff pollution. Here are some helpful tips so you can do your part to reduce water runoff pollution.

- Buy "environmentally safe" household cleaners.
  - Properly store all toxic materials.
- Take all unwanted hazardous materials and containers to local collection sites.
  - Use kitty litter or other absorbent to remove spills from pavement.
  - Use pesticides, herbicides and fertilizers sparingly and carefully.
    - Use a broom instead of a hose to clean up yard clippings.
    - Pick up animal wastes and dispose of them in garbage cans.
- Maintain your septic system. Septic systems require regular inspections, maintenance and pumping.
