Cross Connection and Back Flow Inspection

The State of Oregon requires the City to submit a report stating that all underground water sources, **including sprinkler systems**, have a cross connection and back flow restrictor. It is required that we receive annual inspection reports to verify they are working properly.

How to Keep Your Septic System Maintained



Here are some helpful tips to keep your septic system working properly in addition to having your septic tank pumped out regularly.

- DON'T flush material that will not easily decompose.
- DON'T dig or drive over the septic tank or drain lines
- DON'T use septic tank additives.
- DO use easily biodegradable laundry detergent, soap, & other household supplies.
- DO cover the drain field with grass to prevent erosion.

If you are experiencing any signs of system failure, such as pools or puddles of water near the drain field, gurgling, or slow drains we recommend contacting a professional or calling the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality at (541) 687-7426 to discuss these issues.

Important Information

It is important that you keep the area on top of and around your water meter clear of debris. Our equipment must be able to communicate with the meter, having debris on top can hinder this. Also please do not block access to meter, for example by blocking driveway access, we must get close to the meter to get the reading.
