

Coal Mine Vertical Projection

Scotts Mills, like many communities in Oregon, had early settlers who were industrious and looking for ways to use local resources which could support their local families and other communities. One such short-lived endeavor was the coal mine, located on Block 4 of the Scotts Mills town site, at the corner of what is now 1^{st} Street and Grandview Ave.

In February of 1907, enough evidence was found to explore the area for coal so the Oregon Diamond Coal Mining and Developing Company leased mineral rights from at least 39 property owners in the city. A small drilling crew, headed up by Henry D. Stanley, found coal along Butte Creek at a depth of 302 feet. The company then purchased Block 4 and the Friends Colony Lot 121 next to Block 4 in March of 1908 to continue their exploration in hopes of finding large amounts of high-quality coal.

By October of 1908, the exploration included a shaft 732 feet in length, which reached a vertical depth of approximately 360 feet. Along this shaft a 4-inch seam of coal was found and at 685 feet along the incline, a fault line was encountered which showed evidence of a broken coal formation, described by mining engineer A. S. Wells, as "first class bituminous coal of a coking quality." A main seam, however, was never located.

As a result, the operation phased out, and the Oregon Diamond Coal Mining and Developing Company sold the property to Butte Falls Prune Growers Association for \$1 in January 1909. In the mid-fifties through the mid-sixties, there was an open front building used to receive berries from local farms for the Birds Eye Cannery in Woodburn, Oregon, that was attended by Art Boyts. In later years the property was used as a local playground for bike riding and dirt bike riding. If you weren't careful, you would come home with a really bad case of poison oak. A family home is located there now, next to scenic Butte Creek.
